EAB's CHURCH PLANTS and EVANGELISTIC WORK by John Medcraft

In this EAB's 80th year our evangelistic ministry presses ahead as it has from day one! From tiny very poor villages to violent large cities EAB is always seeking to plant churches as lighthouses of God's gospel.

The latest church plant is underway in the Pernambuco state capital Recife, 75 miles south of our headquarters state capital of João Pessoa. This has long been a strategic aim of EAB so as to expand the work further in this neighboring State, whilst being within a logistically supportable range of our nearest church. Thus João Pessoa is overseeing the church plant in Recife where two mature Christian couples are at the core of the new venture for God. Please pray for Mauro and Edna alongside Luzildo and Gilmara.

About 260 miles west of Recife takes us to Princesa Isabel in Paraíba State where EAB built its first church nearly eight decades ago. There we are planting a number of churches in the small villages of the area where previous Gospel witness has never been established. Whereas Recife has a population of over 1.6 million these small villages have populations in the hundreds, but they all need the Gospel.

At the moment in special need of support in prayer are church plants at such places as Lagoa de São João, Belém, Jurema, Fonseca, Travessia, Ipueira and Pocinhos. EAB has 83 churches in this its 80th year and all your prayer and support is much appreciated so that God's truth might continue to march on!

CARNIVAL CAMP 2018

We spent a whole day working in the Tambor community where our students live. It's a very poor community.

They feel forgotten by government but they are loved by us. 95 volunteers from the church got together and offered many different services. Nurses, doctors, dentists, physiotherapist, hairdressers, lawyers, teachers and other professionals got together to offer this community proper care.

While adults were receiving different types of services, children were taken care of by Action school teachers and volunteers look after them. The day ended with a meeting. There was a lot of worship and it was the perfect way to end the day.

Later in the month when the school singing group took part in the service a mother came to church specially to give her testimony about how her son's life changed since he started coming to Action school.

SOUP RUN

Last year a group of people from EAB/ACEV's Patos church wanted to reach out to the poor so asked them what they needed most and the answer was food!

It was because of that need that I spent an afternoon with a team cutting up piles of vegetables to make 130 litres of thick vegetable soup which we then decanted into individual containers.

The team loaded up a van and we were off to the Placas slum area to distribute soup and rolls to the people who live there.

It is a poor and dangerous slum, but we were accompanied by the police part of the time!

The distribution of food gives the needy the opportunity to receive Gospel leaflets and ask about Jesus, and sometimes the team are asked to pray for the sick.

Since my visit the team have increased their visits to include breakfast for those living on the streets. When you see their faces they can hardly understand how people care enough about them to bring them food.

The work, led by Gylmara (John and Liz's daughter-in-law), is hard, difficult and sometimes dangerous, but it is so rewarding to see the smiles of recipients, and know that you are able to touch those in need with the love of Christ.



DRUG-FREE PROJECT

We are now having evening "drug-free" project meetings each week. The meetings are for people who have stopped using drugs and are fighting to stay off them, or the same for excessive alcoholism.

The meetings are also to support the families of people affected by a family member on drugs or alcoholism.

Last night we had people pouring their hearts out with all the stress of seeing family members under the grips of drugs or drink.

It was wonderful to be able to really minister into these families.

We have just ended 3 days of training for the expansion of the Drug Free Project which all went very well indeed though extremely intense and exhausting. In all 61 were trained in Patos and João Pessoa.
